FROM THE PRINCIPAL

The 2009-2010 school year was a great year for Page High School. Our school grew in numbers to house approximately 1850 students, making us the second largest school in Guilford County (behind Northwest).

The most exciting venture that we began was developing a plan to upgrade the athletic complex. As part of a prior bond package, Page will receive well over a million dollars. We used the master plan that was developed several years ago and reassessed some changing needs. Our goal was to use the money in a way that would most effectively serve the community for many years to come. The plan has now been completed and we expect work to begin following the 2010 football season with the completion date of 2012. We look forward to keeping you updated on the progress of these capital improvements.

The Alumni Association was, once again, very active in the life of Page. Today a new flagpole is being installed in front of the school. This was made possible through funding from your Association. The Alumni and Friends student scholarships were presented at our Senior Awards Program in May to five very deserving students. In addition, our media center is undergoing some updating and renovation to be more student-friendly through collaboration between the school and the Alumni.

We at Page are dedicated to helping maintain the strong traditions of excellence in scholarship, the arts, athletics,

and citizenship. Some notable accomplishments include:

- \$9.1 million in scholarship money, an increase of almost \$2 million from the prior year
- Acceptance to more than 90 universities and colleges by our senior class
- 41% of the senior class Honor Graduates, with one Presidential Scholar and eleven NC scholars
- 887 Advanced Placement Tests administered (results are pending)
- A growing, thriving IB Program, opening the 2010 year with almost 200 prospective and diploma IB students
- State Soccer Champion (boys)
- Three state winners in Technology competition who will move on to Nationals
- Gains in state End-of-Course scores for the third consecutive year
- Teacher Teresa McNeill awarded the North Carolina Teaching Excellence Award, positioning her as a current finalist at the national level
- Winner of the Wachovia Cup for overall athletic program excellence for the Metro 4A Conference

We are very proud of our students' and staff's accomplishments, and we will continue to maintain Page's good name in all that we do.

RICHARD MONTANA REELS FOR RESEARCH

The second annual *Reelin' for Research* Offshore Fishing Tournament took place on Saturday May 1, 2010, off the coast of Morehead City, NC. The purpose was to raise money for the NC Children's Promise for Cancer Research, the fund-raising arm of the NC Children's Hospital in Chapel Hill.

The origin of this tournament goes back several years when my friend since birth, Richard Montana ('98), called up the old gang from Page to arrange a fishing trip. At that time the only goal of the trip was to have a good time, with the possibility of it becoming an "annual event."

This, however, did not go quite as planned. Richard's father, Tony, was diagnosed with cancer a couple of years later, passing away less than a year after his original diagnosis. Tony's death was a very tragic blow to Richard, his mother Margaret, his sister Anne Margaret ('95), and all of Tony's family and friends. And obviously fishing with

wasn't exactly top priority for any of us during the months of Tony's illness and the weeks/months following his death.

However, after Tony's death we all put our heads together and figured out how we could convert our annual fishing trip into more than just a simple get-together for a few old high school buddies. We decided to turn the trip into a fund


-raising event that stood for something that Tony would be proud of fighting kids' cancer! Throughout his illness, Tony told Richard that he had lived a good. long life and was thankful for it. But it always upset Tony when he thought about the young children who were stricken with cancer, and how unfair it was that their lives would be cut so short.


Using Tony's hopes and dreams as their cause. Richard and Anne gathered a small group of friends and formed the steering committee for the Reelin' for Research Offshore Fishing Tournament, and the rest would become history.

The first ever Reelin' for Research Tournament took place in May of 2009, and it was a huge success. A fleet of 16 boats (six anglers per boat) weathered the ten-foot seas for a great day of fishing. After all was said and done, we raised just over \$26,000 to donate to the NC Children's Promise.

Fast forward to present day, and I know Tony is definitely smiling

down on us all! The second annual Reelin' for Research is now in the books, and this one surpassed all of our hopes and expectations. Twenty-nine boats participated in this year's RFR, and our donation tally of \$70,000+ has almost tripled that of the 2009 tournament!

PARKER WOOD WHITE ('97)....HELPING THE WORLD, ONE CHILD AT A TIME

After 1997 Page alumna Parker Wood White graduated from UNC in 2001, she headed to Washington, DC. For the next six anda-half years she worked in the political arena for Senators Jesse Helms, Bill Frist, and Richard Burr. She worked as a Legislative Correspondent, on Republican elections, and in the Capitol. She was Senator Burr's scheduler until the day before her

daughter Avery was born in Arlington, VA, in July of 2007. In early 2008 she, her husband Robert, and Avery moved back to Greensboro. Her son, Perrin Robert White, was born May 26, 2010.

Becoming a mother gave Parker an entirely new outlook on life. She realized she had to do something to help children in her community.

Once I had Avery, my entire perspective changed, and I knew that I wanted to do something that would have a big impact on children. I realized how helpless Avery was and how much she depended on me. It made me sad to think of all the parents that wanted to give their children everything (including food) and didn't have the ability to provide for them. I couldn't imagine my children ever being hungry, and I wanted to help out other families that need that extra helping hand.

The more I looked for a way to make an impact in my community, the more fully I understood how important good nutrition is to the overall well-being of a child. Hungry children are not ready to learn.

Half of the Guilford County Schools children are on free or reduced lunch. Many of these go home to little or no food over the weekend. Statistics show that when they return to school on Monday and again are fed, it takes 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ days (until Wednesday afternoon) for them to be ready to learn. So basically these children are receptive to learning only half of the time they are in school.

I had heard about BackPack programs around the country whose purpose is to provide nutrition to children, and I knew that there was not a countywide one here. Although some local churches are doing an amazing job of helping

students in local schools, Guilford County lacked an organized program. So our BackPack Beginnings program was born. Our goal is to feed the hungry children of Guilford County by providing school-aged children at risk of hunger with backpacks full of nutritious, childfriendly foods to take home over the weekends during the school year.

BackPack
Beginnings is a part
of a national

Feeding America program

and was launched in Guilford County in January 2010 at Wiley Elementary and Shiloh Head Start, feeding 50 elementary students and 15 preschoolers, with plans to feed more than 100 students in the fall. In March, our own BackPack Beginnings became a Charitable Purpose Fund under the Community Foundation of Greater Greensboro. By partnering with Second Harvest Food Bank and Guilford Child Development, we have been able to garner community support and interest while feeding children at a lower cost.

Our main expense is supplying food and backpacks to these children. Picking up the food, then filling and distributing the backpacks, is done by volunteers. As we receive more money, we'll be able to increase the number of children and schools we are able to serve.



WORK ON THE ALMA PINNIX HILL CONTINUES

The Page Alumni and Friends and PTSA have collaboratively funded the restoration of the Alma Pinnix Hill these past two years. Most of the plants we put in the ground last fall on the Cone Blvd. side of the hill survived the harsh winter. There were a few exceptions, but we were generally pleased with the survival rate. After all, we had an extended harsh freeze several weeks after we planted. Despite spreading a fair amount of mulch last fall, weeds continue to require maintenance (and probably always will).

June brought a number of scorching hot days; therefore, a significant amount of manual watering with hoses, sprinklers, and buckets was taking place. At the annual meeting in May, Page alumnus **John McPhail ('86)** offered to help with the installation of a drip line. Now Let's Update the Auditorium

Completed in 1962, four years after the school opened, the Page High School auditorium has now fallen into disrepair and needs some attention. Not only is the auditorium a part of Page's history, but it is still among the most widely used rooms within the school today. Great new carpet was installed last summer. And the lighting and sound systems have had minimal updating along with the addition of acoustic panels. But outdated systems are subpar at best. This is *surely* not the way we want to project Page into the community.

While we have so much to offer in the way of high quality, award-winning, student-run productions and musical performances, we have a space that is sorely lacking in comfort and the accoutrements of a fine theater. We would like to undertake an ambitious renovation plan that would make the Page venue attractive for community concerts. musical productions, and other theatrical uses. This vision includes but is not limited to partnering with outside organizations such as Community Theater of Greensboro, The Shakespeare Festival, Greensboro Symphony, or even the Eastern Music Festival. In a nutshell, we could make our auditorium a magnet for theatrical and musical performance within Greensboro. The additional attention from community partners could augment student groups such as the Page Playmakers, Page Band, and the Page Orchestra. To do this, we must start with a broad vision and a "sky's the limit" attitude. If need be, we can always do it in phases, but we must start with a plan.

In the year 2012, Page High School Auditorium will be celebrating 50 years! Wouldn't it be great to launch a refurbishment project that would coincide with the 50th anniversary? New seats, lights, sound system, paint, and a renovation of the auditorium bathroom facilities could

make Page a destination for many events throughout our community. We could host many of the All-State, All-County, and All-District events for music and theater in a venue that is second to none! Page's reputation for academic success can be strengthened through public events that highlight our performance-oriented programs. Many great accomplishments occur at Page beyond the realm of sports teams and academics, and we need to tell our story!

The auditorium has long been the nexus of Page student life, but now it can become a symbol for the greater community. What we need is for *ALL* Page alumni and friends to help us make this happen....and it is not all about money. Do you have expertise in sound systems? Do you have connections through business, church, or other organizations that might be helpful to this effort?

You are invited to jump in here and help us formulate a plan to take our auditorium into the 21st century! If you have connections with builders, architects, designers, carpenters, furniture manufacturers, or sound companies, then please step forward to help jumpstart this effort. If you have never been involved with Page Alumni and Friends and if you have never contributed monetarily, then this is a chance for you to make something large happen. Think of what you would like to see incorporated in a performance complex and let us know!

PAGE MEDIA CENTER STUDY LOUNGE

Several years ago, as part of a bond issue, the Media Center was expanded. Lovely carpet was laid, and the huge area was filled with great new tables and chairs.

This year, Librarians Jennifer Kunka and Lori Warner decided the space could be more inviting and user-friendly. They rearranged bookcases and furniture, while handling every book in the media center at least once. They created a more inviting entrance. But they felt it was still lacking something.

So they set about planning a space with sectional seating and bistro-like tables and chairs. This proposed space is an area where students can sit and quietly visit, use their wireless laptops, read, or study.

Mrs. Foley and the rest of the administration supported the proposed plan and agreed to cover the expenses for replacing the flooring in the 12x23-foot space with vinyl that looks like hardwood flooring. This will set the space apart from the rest of the Media Center. The Page Alumni and Friends Association offered to fund the purchase of the furniture for the Study Lounge. The furniture was selected for teen appeal, functionality, and durability.

The flooring replacement and painting should take place during the month of July, and the furniture should arrive by early August. Page High School continues to move forward in the use of 21st Century skills for teaching and learning. This year, Guilford County Schools began providing Gaggle student email accounts for all middle and high school students. Gaggle is a filtered and monitored email that includes options for teachers to create blogs for their classes, as well as homework drop boxes and discussion boards.

All teachers also have web pages to facilitate communication with students and parents. The school web page, located at http://schoolcenter.gcsnc.com/page high, is the place to find out about almost everything happening at Page. The web page provides information about academic programs, clubs, athletics, parent and alumni groups, and a calendar of events. There are also links to the counseling department's page and the media center. The graduation project handbook and other important documents are accessible for downloading from school or home.

Another way Page is now providing information is through our new Twitter account. Follow @pagehighpirates on Twitter and get instant updates about things happening at school. Click the link on our web page to sign up!

Page teachers and students are excited about our new *iPod Touch* cart. The cart is a mobile unit of 30 *iPod Touches* available for checkout out by teachers for use in their classrooms. The iPods have apps for different subject areas and can be used for Internet research with wireless access throughout the school.
