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## SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

In its first year, the Page Alumni and Friends Association awarded four merit-based scholarships. Applicants were required to have a 3.0 weighted GPA, be accepted to a four-year college or university, have attended Page High School for four years, write an essay ("A Pause on the Road – What Page Has Meant to Me"), and be interviewed by the scholarship committee. Below is a brief bio of each of these outstanding students.



**Autumn Gabrielle Bailey**, daughter of Sherry Bailey and the late Carl Bailey ('66), describes herself as an honest, devoted, and motivated person – in academics and in life. Art, in media ranging from pastels to acrylics, has been a central focus of her life since she was a little girl. She has broadened her skills in her art classes at Page.

Summer volunteer experiences at Moses Cone and Wesley Long Community Hospitals have not only given Autumn insight into health care careers, but have also given her real-life practice interacting with patients, doctors, nurses, and other hospital staff. The opportunity to work in a hospital pharmacy has strengthened her interest in pharmacology, which she plans to pursue at UNC-Chapel Hill.

## ATHLETICS FACILITY MASTER PLAN THE WAITING TIME IS OVER...LET THE WORK BEGIN

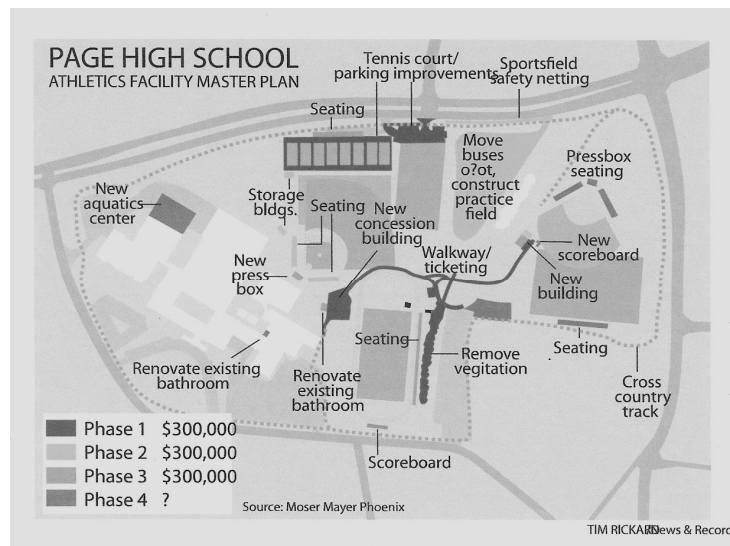
In the summer of 2006, a vision was created, plans were designed, and fundraising ideas were implemented for a new Master Athletic Complex. Work has begun on the initial project of the first phase of our plan.

### **Phase 1 – Done (or almost done)** –

Underbrush removal, clearing behind football visitors stands, and a twenty-foot wide bridge connecting the new Cone fields to existing fields completed (monies raised from this year's Athletic Booster Club Fundraiser) .....Fencing (Page Alumni and Friends Association) and paving (Guilford County Schools, hopefully)

**Phase 1 – To-Be-Done** – Construction of new concessions/restroom facilities, improved tennis parking and new/improved home and visitor stadium entrances

**Phase 2** – Move buses from our landlocked campus to create more practice fields, build permanent seating for baseball, and construct a concessions building to include classroom space, field house, and much needed storage



**Phase 3** – Permanent bleachers for football visitor side, a three-mile cross-country track, renovation of outside restrooms, a baseball press box, permanent seating for tennis, track side fencing, and storage and safety netting for practice fields

**Phase 4** – Hopefully, a plan and not a pipe dream! A new scoreboard for Kirby stadium, outfielders, an aquatics center, additional field lighting, permanent seating for

softball/soccer/lacrosse, additional parking, and safety netting at practice fields

The first three phases are approximately \$300,000 each. Phase 4 is in the millions! Let's dream it into existence!

## PAGE/GRIMSLEY FOOTBALL — TWO BROTHERS, TWO VICTORIES

Just how long did it take for Page to beat Grimsley in football? Well, they didn't play each other the first couple of years, but the fourth game was the charm! In their fourth match-up, the Pirates FINALLY beat Grimsley in 1963 for the first time under the leadership of quarterback Mike King. The next Pirate victory would come four years later under the leadership of Mike's younger brother, quarterback Geoff King.

### The First Time.....

Below are excerpts from 1963 articles from the *Greensboro Daily News*, courtesy of John Cathey and Tom Northington.

*The Pirates of Page were still riding around Cloud Nine today after one master stroke saved their sinking ship and provided them with an especially sweet taste of victory. Last night's victory was the first time the Bucs have ever beaten the Whirlies in football. The official story of the victory is a 43-yard homerun pass from quarterback Mike King to end Terry Skinner.*

*The unofficial story of the bombshell play should read "Assistant Coach Don Stowe to Head Coach Les Swanner." It was Stowe, manning the phones in the press box who spotted the one flaw in the Whirlie armor. He relayed the information to Swanner, who instructed King to fire away.*

Mike passed the ball, Skinner caught the ball, and Jackie Underwood scored the PAT. The fourth hero of the game was Mickey Dean who had blocked the Whirlies' extra point attempt. **Page 7-Grimsley 6!**

### The Second Time.....

Below are excerpts from the October 14, 1967, *Greensboro Daily News*, courtesy of Tom Northington.

*For only the second time in its history, the Page Pirates defeated the Grimsley Whirlies in a hotly contested match-up. Scrambling Geoff King, seemingly trapped for a big loss, escaped for 19 yards around his flank, and a few plays later, tossed a 13-yard touchdown pass right into the arms of Steve Sharpe. Those two plays in the third quarter ignited a real explosion under Page, and the Pirates soon pounced on a Grimsley fumble to set up their winning score early in the fourth period, as Page came up with one big Play after another on third and fourth downs.*

Steve Sharpe caught Geoff King's touchdown pass for the first score. Jim Holbrook "fought his way across the goal line for the second touchdown." **Page 12-Grimsley 7! Way to go, King Brothers!**

## TWO BROTHERS, TWO SUCCESSFUL PATHS FROM PAGE

**David Furr** ('90), has made it to the big screen with some big names – names such as Glenn Close, Meryl Streep, and Vanessa Redgrave!

David started out in music, playing piano at six. By the time he was at Page, his musical talents included guitar, mandolin, and other stringed instruments. His creative focus in high school centered on his Weaver electronic music classes, where he discovered his gift for writing music. David enjoyed attending drama productions, but he never took part or visualized anything of that sort in his future. In fact, he pictured himself majoring in music in college.

At ASU, David discovered his interest in acting. He designed his own major of interdisciplinary studies including theatre, film, music, and photography. He worked at Shakespeare festivals around the country, including several stints at the High Point N.C. Shakespeare Festival. In 1998 he received an MFA in acting from the Alabama Shakespeare Festival, moving to New York in 1999.

David continues to write music he describes as "acoustic with a mountain influence," and he plays piano or guitar in clubs around the city. He has

appeared on Broadway (including *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* with Kathleen Turner), in Off-Broadway, and on television. His latest role is his first movie role, that of Ralph Haverford in *Evening*. The highlight for him in this movie role was the experience of stepping into that world at that level!

**Mike Furr**, David's older brother, is a 1988 Page graduate. His main interests were hanging out with his friends and playing racquetball. Mike can definitely relate to students that are wondering what their major will be or what they will do with the rest of their lives, as it was not until college and grad school that he really focused in on his own skills and interests. A Page teacher that really stands out for him is John Meyer, a teacher that just

made learning more fun! (*Mike didn't take psychology from Mr. Meyer, but Mr. Meyer is still teaching psychology at Page.*)

After earning a BA from William and Mary, an MS from Villanova, and a PhD from the University of California, Riverside, Mike joined the Psychology Department at ASU. Since 2004, he has been in the Psychology Department at Wake Forest, teaching and writing.

Currently, he is working to publish his first book, *Psychometrics: An Introduction*, a textbook to be used for upper-level and graduate courses. With a topic such as psychometrics, he "doesn't expect to be invited into Oprah's Book Club or to be in the New York Times Bestseller List," but he's OK with that!

Mike says David "got every bit of creative talent in the family," and David says Mike is making a scientific contribution to our society. They are two brothers who are Page graduates, finding success in very divergent paths. Page was a place to lay an educational foundation, interact with peers, and "get ready" for the rest of their lives. Congratulations, David and Mike. And keep in touch!

## CHARTER TEACHER—IRIS HUNSINGER



Looking for someone who loves Page High School? There's no one more passionate about Page than Iris Hunsinger! Her career in education started in 1940 after graduating from East Carolina and ended with her retirement in 1979. The highlight was her time at Page, 1958-1972, as charter principal, Luther Medlin, had asked her to teach English at the new Walter Hines Page High School.

Two of Mrs. Hunsinger's greatest contributions to Page involve the school newspaper and the AP program. She was advisor to the first newspaper staff and gave it the name, *Pages by Page*. This student newspaper is about to begin its 50<sup>th</sup> year of reporting!

After reading about the AP program in other systems, she received permission to do an independent study on the

Advanced Placement program as renewal for her teaching certificate. She became so sold on AP, that she wrote a course of study outlining admission into the program, then went to the Greensboro City Schools Board asking to incorporate the AP program at Page. The response was "no," unless the same was done for Grimsley. Fortunately, a Grimsley teacher agreed. So the new AP program was born in the Page English Department, the Grimsley History Department, and the Greensboro City Schools – thanks to Page teacher, Iris Hunsinger!

She loved Page sports, especially wrestling and football. Her son John was on the wrestling team, so she never missed a wrestling match. She also recalls running up and down the sidelines, willing and cheering the Page football team to a first-and-ten or touchdown! For the first few years, all home games were played at Grimsley, as Page did not yet have a football field. (Imagine her surprise when told ALL Page/Grimsley football games are STILL played at Grimsley!) After each home game, a dance was held in the auditorium lobby.

In 1972, Mrs. Hunsinger became the first female high school administrator in the city, serving as the assistant principal at Smith High School until 1979. After retirement, she did some independent consulting in curriculum construction, volunteered in different areas, and traveled to 34 foreign countries. Nowadays, her travels don't take her too far from home, but her wonderful memories are a treasure!

So, Mrs. Iris Hunsinger, thank you for all you have given us – for your contributions, your enthusiasm, and the legacy you have left at Page High School!

## FIRST AP.....Now IB

Page's tradition for academic excellence has taken great strides forward in the 21st century. Our AP Program has experienced phenomenal growth over the past six years. We presently offer 21 AP courses and are in the process of adding another. Over 400 of our students have earned recognition as AP Scholars since 2001. We have had nine students recognized as AP National Scholars, and we are anticipating two more for 2007. Annually, only .017% of all high school students are recognized by College Board as National Scholars.

Under the direction of AP/IB Coordinator John Meyer, Page is also in the process of becoming an International Baccalaureate Diploma School. We will have a site visitation this fall and plan to start teaching IB courses in the fall of 2008. Our goal is to mesh the IB and AP programs and give our students the "Best of all Possible Worlds." We already have 65 Pre-IB students for the coming year, and we fully expect to have several hundred within the next two years.

## UNDER CONSTRUCTION

A grand time was had by ALL who attended the annual Athletic Booster Club's fundraiser, Saturday April 28, at Sherwood Swim and Racquet Club! This was the first time the Booster Club had sponsored an all-adult evening – an evening with a DJ, silent and live auctions, and Split-the-Pot.

The Booster Club raised \$22,000 that will directly impact all students at Page, with most of the proceeds going towards the Athletic Complex.
