Our Page Alumni and Friends Association is in its fourth year. What have we accomplished so far?

- We have supported the Athletic Booster Club's Athletics Facilities
 Master Plan by being instrumental in getting a bathroom/concessions
 building built on the athletic field.
- We have given four student scholarships annually.
- We have helped with the Page-Grimsley Golf tournament.
- We have given teacher scholarships.
- We are responsible for the ongoing renewal of the Alma Pinnix Hill.
- We gave the auditorium lobby a facelift and some seating.
- We have sent out two newsletters yearly.
- We have worked to help folks get started on their reunion planning.

While we are pleased with all of this and what members' funds have helped us do, the number of people actually supporting us is dismally low. FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As we enter the midpoint of the year, it seems to be a time of reflection on both where we are and where we need to go. As our school numbers have grown to 1854, we are now the second largest school in Guilford County. Our successes also grow as we continue to excel in so many areas.

Following the 08-09 year, two of our athletic teams (men's tennis and ladies soccer) posted the highest Grade Point Average in the state for their particular sport. This spring we will be administering 115 International Baccalaureate tests to 78 students and 838 Advanced Placement tests to 440 students. The number of students achieving Honor Status topped 775 students!

This 52-year- old building is simply bricks and steel and paint and plaster – a mere shell. But when the bell rings we transform from a building into a school where our

students come in order to learn and grow in their understanding of themselves and the world around them. As part of a sound education we hold the obligation to also prepare them to understand and meet the challenges of life and to become better human beings because of those challenges.

One way we emphasize this is through community service activities. Organizations in our school support many worthwhile projects. Some of these include: A canned food drive at Thanksgiving

- Donations to Urban Ministries
- Annual blood drives
- Relay for Life
- Pennies for Pasta supporting the Leukemia Foundation
- Operation SMILE
- Raising money for the victims in Haiti
- Coin drive supporting families at the Christmas holiday

In addition, many clubs and most athletic teams support service projects at the school and in the community. Recent undertakings were work on the Alma Pinnix Hill (by our boys soccer and cheerleading teams) and service hours to the Salvation Army (by our baseball team). I

continue to be amazed at both the giving spirit and sensitivity to those in need displayed by our students.

We welcome all Alumni and Friends to come to Page, talk with our students, and see firsthand the outstanding young people that walk these halls. We thank you for continuing to support the school through your time and generous gifts. We will be Pirates Forever!

GRADUATION PROJECT: OUR SENIORS AT THEIR BEST

On February 4th, the first round of seniors presented Graduation Projects to panels of community judges. After working on these projects for two years, this was the culminating event.

Last year, these students chose topics that they were interested in, felt passionate about, or wanted to learn about then wrote research papers on their topics. This year, each senior chose a mentor who was "expert" in his field of interest. Mentor and student worked together a minimum of 15 hours, planning or creating the product. On February 4th, they completed their projects by giving speeches that explained a physical object they had made, a job-shadowing experience, a performance-based product, or a service-oriented event. With 25% of their senior English grade on the line, Page seniors felt a tremendous amount of pressure to succeed. And succeed they did!

Community service projects included a fund-raiser for Juvenile Diabetes; helping build a Habitat for Humanity house; cleaning up streams near Moses Cone Hospital and Page; working with the Park Service; working with Urban Ministry; and creating a web site for sports teams. Handcrafted products included baseball bats, fountain pens, dresses, and furniture. Performance-based products included presentations from those who had taken lessons on guitar, drum, piano, voice, martial arts, yoga, male ballet, and salsa dancing.

Job shadowing opportunities gave students a chance to shadow police officers, veterinarians, health care providers, EMS ambulance drivers, local chefs, and attorneys. Several products spotlighted special areas of interest such as nail design, radio broadcasting, cake decorating, architecture, interior design, and landscape design. Other seniors built hard-drives, composed music, learned to scuba dive, and learned CPR. Some of the mentors worked with students to write a book, design a comic book, or create a fashion magazine.

Judges were very impressed with the preparation and presentations the seniors made. Seniors treated the experience as if they were preparing for a job interview, including professional dress. The whole evening was a tremendous success thanks to the seniors' hard work and dedication. They proved to be Page High School at its best!

PAGE TECHNOLOGY STUDENTS BRING HOME THE BRONZE

Tate Hancock and Thomas King, Page Class of 2009, placed second for SciVis at the National Technology Student Association Event. This event was held in Denver, Colorado, in early July and was attended by students from all over the world. Tate and Thomas had placed first in the North Carolina competition with their animation of Gel Electrophoresis, a three-minute original animation of the nerve impulse using 3D StudioMax and Adobe Premiere. Students and staff at Page High School helped raise money to send the two boys to the national competition, and parent Pat King paid her own way to chaperone the boys so they could attend.

SciVis is a class that is offered in almost every high school in Guilford County and teaches students to visualize scientific concepts using 2D and 3D software. Phyllis Jones teaches SciVis at Page and is also one of the sponsors of the Page Technology Student Association.

ALMA PINNIX HILL REPLANTING CONTINUES

While tending to the weeding around and watering of the new plantings on the Alma Pinnix Road hillside last spring, Charles Wright ventured off to the overgrown side of the hill (on Cone Boulevard) and began diligently cutting down



saplings and pulling ivy. After several trips to the hill – and tolerating mosquitoes, bees, a garter snake or two, and high temperatures – Charles was able to tame the out-of-control vegetation enough to make us believers that Ms. Pinnix's beloved hillside could be completely reclaimed.

Her design perfectly complemented the adjoining hillside that we had already planted in the fall of 2008.

With only a few weeks before planting season, and a hill of ivy that had to be pulled before we could plant, we became desperate for more manpower. As we were about to put the project off for another year, along came Susan

Veazey offering the help of the soon-to-be State Champion Soccer Team. In mid-October, those guys and fellow JV team members used their hands for a change to move our project forward. In just a few hours, Coaches Jaziri and Ettefagh and their players had cleared out enough ivy for us to make plans to start planting. Susan Tysinger cleared much of the debris from the woods at the top of the hill and single-handedly controlled the yellow jacket population, getting stung two or three times.

Not to be outdone by the best high school soccer team in the state, the girls JV cheerleaders asked to help plant the hill. Coach Jennifer Hord and parent Virginia Summerell got the girls to join us on Halloween, before the festivities later that evening. With assistance from such peerless alums as Carol Long, Al Garvey, Charles Wright, Will Maddox, Dean Little, Daniel Craft and future alum Sarah Garvey, we were able to get the hill planted this past Fall.

Considering the hill, on the outskirts of campus, often provides visitors with a first impression of the school, one has to believe all the hard work will leave guests with a favorable one. REMEMBERING COACH DONALD STOWE



Coach Donald Stowe was a veteran of the U.S. Coast Guard, having served during World War II. He graduated from Appalachian State when it was App State Teachers College and earned a Master's in Education from UNC-G. He was hired as a coach and teacher at Page the first year the school opened in 1958 and was an assistant football coach and

head baseball coach for some years. He was at Page 12 years, his last four as an assistant principal. He worked in our school system for 31 years, then taught at GTCC for 12 more after that.

Coach Stowe was a wonderful person, a really good coach, and a mentor to a bunch of young folks over a long period of time. I first met him the first day of football "two-a

-days" in mid August 1960, before I had ever set foot in the school. Back then Page was a three-year high school. When I walked into the locker room, I am sure he could tell some of us newcomers were a bit intimidated. He spent some time talking to each one of us individually – not really about football but about our various backgrounds, school, and so forth – just trying to put us at ease. He was a very calm guy, could show emotion, but rarely raised his voice. If he did, we darn well knew to listen!

He stayed active in youth baseball in Greensboro through the end of his life. Since I have also stayed active in youth baseball and help with the Page baseball team, I was fortunate enough to be able to see him fairly frequently over the years, especially during the spring and summer when baseball is in high gear. It's also great to see his son, Donnie, Jr. ('77), at Page from time to time doing things like selling tickets at various varsity and junior varsity events.

To be able to stay connected for 50 years to someone who meant so much to me in my own youth is a very special gift. Coach Stowe died in November 2009. We'll miss you, Coach!


